

UKG – ACTIVITY SHEET- VOWELS AND CONSONANTS

Learning letter sounds is one of the first steps in learning to read. And while most consonant sounds are easy to grasp, vowel sounds can be entirely different. For this, child first needs to understand what a vowel is.

Vowels and Consonants Activities for teaching and learning at home.

Activity 1.


Let the child write the five vowels on a paper and against each vowel draw or paste a picture corresponding to the letter. Have the paper hang in a visible spot and keep revising the sound. Let the child add more pictures later.



Activity 2

The child can write a to z on a sheet of paper. With parents help cut out the individual letters and put them in a bag. This can be a game played by parents and the child together.

- a) Each one takes a turn to take out one paper from the bag and tell if it is vowel or a consonant.
- b) The same may be used to develop further. When each one takes out a letter, they should tell if it is a vowel or a consonant and say the name of an object starting with the letter.



Activity 3

The child can take the newspaper or magazine and colour the vowels in "blue".

Parent can call out a consonant or its sound and the child has to find three of that letter in the paper and colour it "pink".
